SMS Messaging and Consent

Ministry of Reconciliation Church uses SMS text messaging for conversational, person-to-person communication between authorized church staff or ministry leaders and individuals who choose to communicate with the church by text message.

SMS communications may include pastoral or ministry support, prayer-related communication, visitor follow-up, meeting or appointment coordination, responses to ministry needs, requested church information, and other church-related conversational communication. SMS messaging is not used for mass marketing, promotional campaigns, or automated bulk messaging.

How Individuals May Consent to SMS Messaging

Individuals may consent to receive SMS messages from Ministry of Reconciliation Church by providing a mobile telephone number and expressly agreeing to receive SMS messages; requesting that an authorized church representative communicate with them by text message; providing verbal consent during an in-person or telephone conversation; selecting an optional SMS consent checkbox on an applicable church website form; or initiating an SMS conversation with an authorized Ministry of Reconciliation Church representative.

Consent to receive SMS messages is voluntary and is not a condition of receiving ministry services, attending worship services, participating in church activities, or receiving assistance from Ministry of Reconciliation Church.

Verbal SMS Consent

When consent is obtained verbally in person or over the telephone, an authorized church representative will inform the individual that Ministry of Reconciliation Church is requesting permission to communicate with the individual by SMS.

May Ministry of Reconciliation Church send you text messages at the mobile number you provided regarding your visit, inquiry, ministry needs, pastoral or ministry support, prayer-related communication, appointments, requested church information, or other church-related communication? Message frequency varies. Message and data rates may apply. Reply HELP for help or STOP at any time to unsubscribe. Your consent to receive text messages is voluntary.

If the individual agrees, Ministry of Reconciliation Church may communicate with the individual by SMS for the requested or related conversational purpose.

Website or Written SMS Consent

When an individual is given the opportunity to consent to SMS messaging through an applicable Ministry of Reconciliation Church website form, the SMS consent option will be voluntary and will not be preselected.

By selecting this option, I agree to receive conversational SMS text messages from Ministry of Reconciliation Church regarding my inquiry, visit, ministry needs, pastoral or ministry support,

prayer-related communication, appointments, requested church information, and other church-related communications. Message frequency varies. Message and data rates may apply. Reply HELP for help or STOP to unsubscribe. SMS consent is voluntary and is not a condition of receiving ministry services.

Message Frequency and Charges

Message frequency varies depending upon the individual's request, needs, and ongoing conversation with Ministry of Reconciliation Church.

Ministry of Reconciliation Church does not charge individuals for its SMS messaging service. However, message and data rates may apply depending upon the individual's wireless carrier and service plan.
